In the 50 years since Manson followers committed brutal murders in Los Angeles, the crimes have taken on a tremendous role in pop culture. The shocking murder of actress Sharon Tate and her friends, as well as brutal murders of Leno and Rosemary LaBianca the following night were seen as a dark end to the "summer of love" and the innocence of the era.

Charles Manson himself became an object of fascination and even after his death in 2017 still has acolytes. How could a man that spent most of his life in prison seduce and charm people into following him and then committing murder?

To try and figure out how Manson operated — and why he appealed to young women in particular — I went out with the production crewthat filmed the upcoming Oxygen special "Manson: The Women," airing on Saturday, August 10 at 7 p.m. ET/PT. Producers conducted rare interviews with four key members of the Manson family: Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme, Sandra Good, Dianne Lake and Catherine Share (aka Gypsy) – none

of whom were ever convicted or connected to any of the murders committed by other Manson followers.

Lake testified against Manson and Share later renounced her involvement with the family and had plastic surgery to remove the X that she and other women burned and carved into themselves while he was on trial. Fromme and Good still speak glowingly of Manson and his belief system and the love and acceptance they felt as members of the family. All four give a fascinating glimpse into what lured them into living with him on Spahn ranch, and why they wanted to be part of the group.

















DID YOU KNOW...

- Manson was married three times, and engaged a fourth time.
- 2. Manson was cremated, and his ashes were spread at a secret location near Porterville, California.
- The Beach Boys asked Manson to perform with them in Texas in 1968, but he couldn't go because he was on parole.
- Manson was a staunch environmentalist. He founded a charity called Air, Trees, Water, Animals. He was so committed to animal rights he wouldn't kill insects despite being convicted for multiple murders.
- Manson escaped prison in 1957 and was caught in the parking lot.
